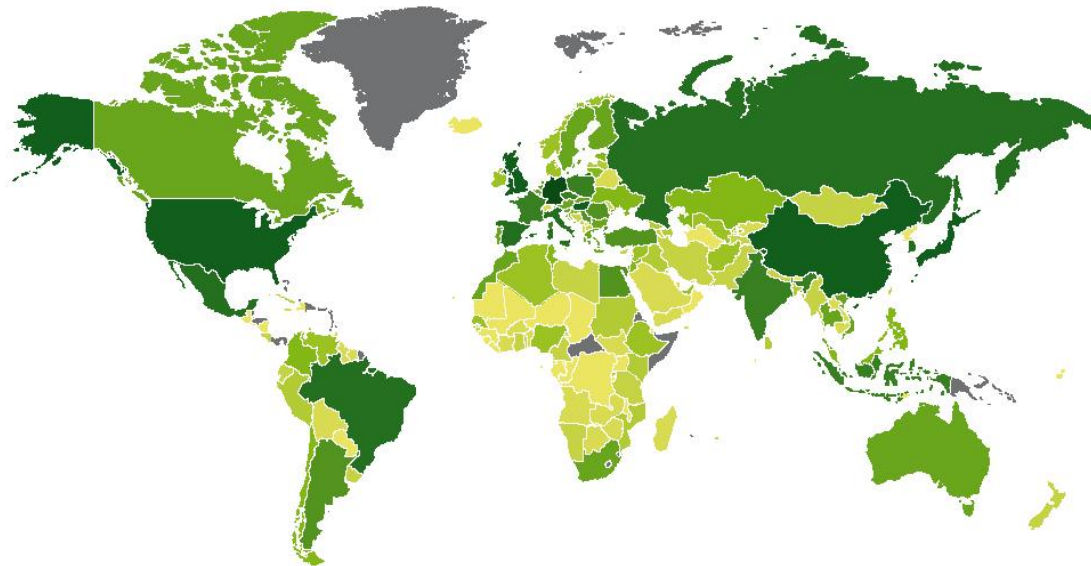
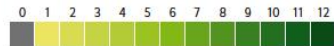

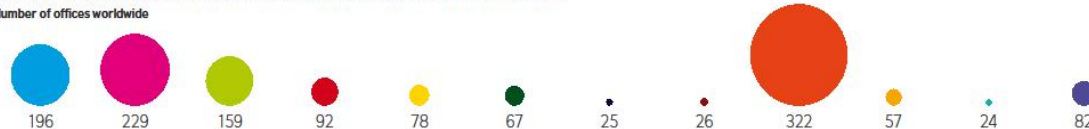
WHERE ARE COUNTRIES FOCUSING THEIR CULTURAL RELATIONS ACTIVITY GLOBALLY?

GLOBAL BREAKDOWN OF INTERNATIONAL CULTURAL RELATIONS INSTITUTIONS

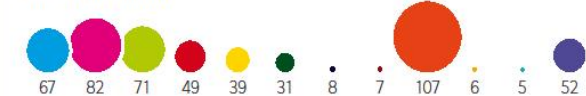

	2.4 Capacity Building in Higher Education: cooperation with partner countries in the field of HEIs aiming to modernize the HE system through New curricula & degrees, learning and teaching methodologies, staff development, quality assurance, governance, Bologna tools (Joint Projects) and stimulating reforms at national level with support of authorities in Partner Countries (Structural projects)	3.4 Cooperation with international organisations: Projects aimed at fostering the policy dialogue both with international organizations (such as OECD and Council of Europe) and with Partner Countries to promote the international attractiveness of EHEA in the world
		3.5 Stakeholder dialogue, policy and Programme promotion: transnational projects which support the active participation of young people in democratic life and fosters debate around topics centered on the themes and priorities set by the Structured Dialogue and the renewed political framework in the youth field. Such projects can take the form of meetings, conferences, consultations and events.

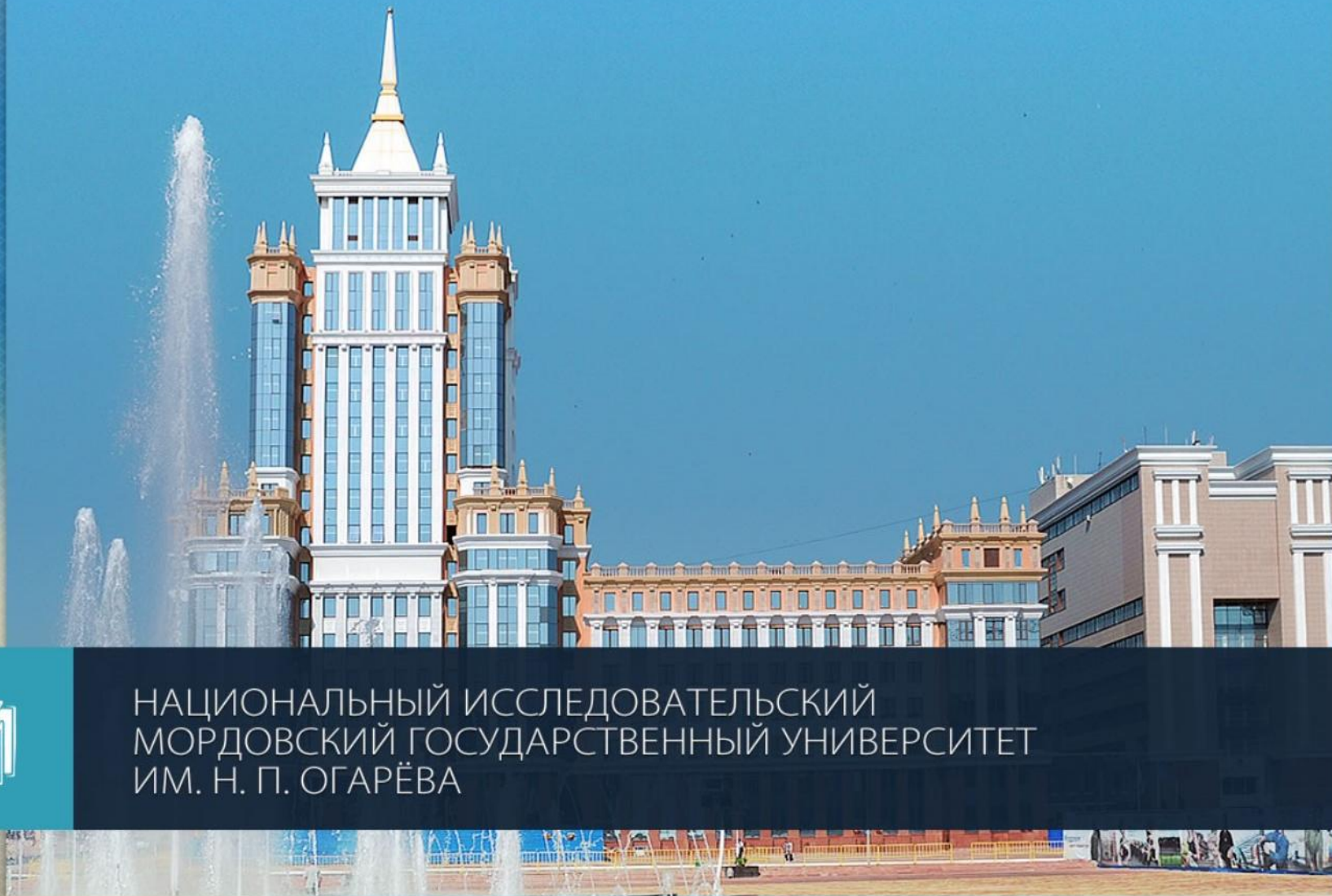
