Introduction

The history of migration is the history of humanity. From the very beginning, people have always looked for the most convenient places. Large number of people regularly commute to work, schools, universities or even visit their relatives in another city/country and then come back home without thinking that they are actually participants of the migration process, i.e. migrants.

Migration issues affect more or less all people: migrants themselves, societies of countries of origin and societies of host countries. For example, when people of active working age leave to other countries in order to improve their material well-being this can lead to a range of problems, such as skill drain, staff shortage, diminution of taxes, youth population decline in the overall population structure and others. Host countries are addressing all these issues thanks to immigration, but they are also receiving new ones related to the attitude towards new members of society, the processes of adaptation and integration of immigrants into their new environment. All of this demonstrates the need for an integrated approach to the study of migration issues and the important role that migration plays in the life of societies and states.

That is why the subject "Europe's migration problems" is compulsory in the variable part of the curriculum of bachelor's degree program in "International Regional Studies".

The purpose of this study guide is to present the material on the sociocultural aspects of migration in the European region, accumulated through practical pedagogical activities.
