



The need for reform Dublin Regulation 1990



States applying Dublin instruments:

Dublin regulation
EU-Denmark agreement
non-EU member states with an agreement to apply the provisions

European Council (summer 2018)

- countries expand powers of EU border service Frontex
- countries strengthen Frontex personnel
- set up refugee camps in North African countries with UN assistance
- agreed on the possibility of creating closed camps for migrants in the EU where they would wait to consider their asylum applications



Council of the European Union

Integration of migrants and refugees

- Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund and Europe for Citizens
- The Justice Programme and the Rights, Equality and Citizenship Programme
- Creative Europe and Erasmus+ target activities
- The European Social Fund, the Regional Development Fund and the Employment and Social Innovation Programme
